Why nice isn't working: why relational currency supports positive behaviour

Leading author and behaviour specialist Paul Dix will help us learn how to walk the middle road where we hold high expectations and clear boundaries whilst creating a secure and nurturing learning environment. Paul will share the 'how to' with practical tips and highly relatable anecdotes.

Speaker Bio

Behaviour specialist, author, education reformer and advisor. Helping teachers and headteachers across the world with transformational relational behaviour practice.

As a teacher, leader and teacher trainer, Paul has been working with the most difficult behaviours in the most challenging contexts for the last 27 years. Miraculously Paul studied at Homerton College Cambridge after countless attempts to sabotage his own education.

Paul fell in love with teaching while working as a Teaching Assistant after leaving school. Teaching both inspired and drew him in due to the creativity, the variety and the cohort after cohort of utterly brilliant children he encountered.

Paul has delivered training and spoken on large stages all over the world, advised the English Department for Education on Teacher Standards, given evidence to the Education Select Committee and carried out extensive work with the Ministry of Justice on Behaviour and Restraint in Youth Custody.

His book When The Adults Change, Everything Changes published in 2017 by Crown House is the best-selling education book of the 21st century. It has sold more than 150,000 copies. The follow-up After The Adults Change was released last year.

Paul's new book 'When the Parents Change Everything Changed' was published by Penguin Random House on September 5th 2023.

A pivotal question emerges: What is our vision for a technologically advanced and human-centric society?

In the face of forthcoming challenges and opportunities, addressing societal changes and enhancing citizens' quality of life, particularly those most vulnerable, requires the effective utilisation of skills, career exploration and well-being support services, and innovation. This keynote will delve into these critical issues, inviting the audience to contemplate future possibilities and shape a proactive path forward.

Speaker Bio

Deirdre Hughes specialises in education, careers, employment and skills policies, research and practice at an international, national and regional level. She is an Associate Professor at the University of Warwick, Institute for Employment Research (IER) and Founding Director of CareerChat (UK) Ltd – a pioneering technology start-up company focused on career exploration and the effective use of artificial intelligence (AI). She is also Managing Director of dmh associates – an independent research and consultancy company.

Some selected examples of her current research include harnessing AI and large language models (LLMS) to support career exploration; career-related learning in primary schools, community places and online spaces for all-age careers support and wellbeing. She has co-edited three new books (in press, Routledge) on Art of the Truth: Creative methods for guidance and counselling; Decent work, inclusion and sustainability; and Migration: Towards a more inclusive society. In 2012, Deirdre was awarded an Order of the British Empire by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II for services to lifelong guidance.

Pooky's knowledge, ideas and advice come from years of study, practice and hard-earned lived experience with PTSD, anorexia, self-harm and depression. She's an autistic mum of two (one biological daughter, one adopted) who enjoys bouldering, paragliding, walking and singing when she's not teaching.

Speaker Bio

Laura McInerney is an education journalist, former teacher, and co-founder of Teacher Tapp, the daily app uncovering teachers' secret lives. She started her career teaching for six years in east London comprehensives before being taken to court by Michael Gove for asking a difficult question about free schools. (She eventually won). Following this, Laura became a journalist, writing a monthly column in The Guardian and editing Schools Week, where her team won national awards for their hard-hitting scoops.

She is now the co-founder of Teacher Tapp, a daily survey app of 10,000 teachers, which reveals previously unknown insights about teachers' lives. For example, it recently found that teachers working in Outstanding schools more often go to the pub together on a Friday (though causation is not yet proven!)

Laura has authored several books, including Leading Academy Trusts with Sir David Carter, and The Juggling Act with Professor Toby Salt. Known for being blunt, Laura is also known for being fair and an equal critic of politicians on either side of the spectrum. She is also a mastermind on past education secretaries – having maintained a database since 2013 detailing the particulars of each one.

Leading Inclusion: What Works?

PAUL JAMES & KATHERINE WALSH

River Learning Trust, an academy trust of twenty-eight schools, places meaningful inclusion at the heart of everything it does. Paul and Katherine will share their Inclusion Strategy and the process they undertook to identify the key priorities. The presentation will include case studies from individual schools identifying small changes that led to significant impact, as well as system-level approaches enabling stronger provision in schools.

Speaker Bio

Paul began his teaching career in 1994 as a teacher of science and has held various senior leadership roles in a range of secondary education settings. He has also been a primary school governor and Interim Executive Board member. Until 2016 he was Headteacher of The Cherwell School, a comprehensive school of over 1900 students, which is currently a Teaching School Hub. He was accredited as a National Leader of Education in 2013 and is the founding Chief Executive of RLT.

Paul is also a member of the steering group for the Community Impact Zone in Oxford which seeks to tackle inequality and increase social mobility. He also Chairs the Oxford Strategic Partnership which brings together senior representatives from the public, business, community and voluntary sectors to help provide direction for the city's future, respond to local priorities and engage more effectively with local concerns. Paul is also a Trustee of the National Foundation for Education Research and a member of the DfE South East Regions Group Advisory Board.

Katherine is an experienced teacher and school leader, bringing more than 15 years' experience to her role. She is an experienced SENCO, with experience leading SEND provision in mainstream schools in England and America. Katherine has taught in both primary and secondary schools as a class teacher, qualified teacher of the deaf and autism resource base teacher.

Over the past ten years, Katherine has developed particular expertise in working with leadership teams to develop school-wide systems, establishing shared and inclusive visions for the education of children and young people with SEND. Katherine is the regional SEND leader for South Central England and Northwest London with Whole School SEND and was a project director for the Educational Endowment Foundation's SEND Review Trial. She contributed to the drafting of the NPQ SENCO Content Framework was a lead author for the Teacher Handbook: SEND.



My journey from apartheid to truth & reconciliation

CHRIS LUBBE

Speaker Bio

Born at a very difficult period in South Africa's history, Chris made a decision very early in his life to become an activist and oppose the racially based system of 'apartheid'. Chris made the decision to choose the path of peaceful resistance which culminated in Nelson Mandela's release from prison on the 11th February 1990. After Nelson Mandela's release from prison in 1990 and the subsequent fall of 'apartheid' Chris was handpicked by Nelson Mandela to become one of his bodyguards. Apart from fulfilling body-guarding duties, Chris became involved in the delicate negotiations with the 'apartheid regime' which resulted in subsequent agreement, the drafting of the new constitution and finally culminating in the first democratic elections in South Africa. Chris worked with Nelson Mandela for 9 years up until his retirement.

As a keynote speaker Chris uses stories from his past to inspire positive change while sharing techniques on overcoming adversity. Chris also covers various themes including determination, courage, humanity, responsibility, courage and forgiveness. Despite meeting a vast array of world leaders and celebrities, Chris draws mainly from the important lessons he learned from working with Nelson Mandela and Desmond Tutu.
